Thank you to the students who participated in the activities with such great co-operation and manners!



LIFE EDUCATION

The Life Education van will be visiting Cooranbong **Public** 28th School from 30th November to November. The lessons provided for students are excellent and

encourage all students to attend. There will be a \$6.00 charge to cover student's workbooks and excursion costs. Please remember and save for this wonderful opportunity so that your child can attend.

Below is a list of the content of lessons presented to each grade.

<u>Early Stage 1 (K) – "Harold's Surprise"</u>: Healthy food choices, importance of physical activity, safety

Stage 1 (Yr 1) - "Harold's Mystery Tour":

Body workings, safe use and storage of medicines, peer pressure and coping strategies, safety, decision making.

Stage 1 (Yr 2) - "Harold's Heroes":

Environmental health issues, emergency procedures, individual needs for medicines and safe use and storage.

Stages 1 & 2 (Yrs 1-3) - "All Systems Go":

Function of body systems, peer pressure, second hand smoking, safety with medicines.

Stage 2 (Yr 3) – "Harold's Diary":

Friendship, resilience, expressing emotions, coping strategies, healthy food choices, active lifestyles.

Stage 2 (Yr 4) - "Mind Your Medicine":

Safe and unsafe situations, medicines and consequence of misuse, peer influence and friendship, positive communication.

Stage 3 (Yr 5) - "The Burning Issue":

Short and long term effects of smoking, effects of passive smoking, laws, peer influence, and refusal skills.

Stage 3 (Yr 6) - "Think Twice":

Consequences of alcohol use and misuse, stay safe situations and refusal skills, laws controlling purchase and use.

Stage 3 (Yrs 5 &6) - "Its Your Call":

Definition of legal drugs, decision making, emotions, peer pressure, risk taking, problem saving.

Regular School Attendance

Information for parents and carers







All children have a right to an education. Only by regular school attendance can children make the most of educational opportunities, leading to greater social and economic outcomes.

Schools play a vital sole in the social and emotional development of children. Regular attendance emobles students to develop a sense of belonging to a peer group and assists in building reportant coping and triendanip skills. Qualished children are less likely to engage in anti-social believieux.

If youtests erior out on the basic scilic in the early years of school, they may experience learning problems in later years. Ultimately, unsatisfactory attentioner at school may affect the examples of the School Certificate.

Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. While perents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, private staff, as a part of their duty of care, incentur part or whele day absences. Perents and schools have specific responsibilities can sening children's attandence at school.

Responsibilities of the principal

Principals are legally responsible for resintaining accurate records of student attendance. When research for absonces are provided to the school by parents, principals are accountable for their decision to recard a student's absonce as justified. Principals may decline to accept as satisfactory on explanation for an absence and will research that absonce as unjustified.

Principals may request medical certification or other documentation when absences equitained as being due to linese err frequent or proharged.

Responsibilities of parents

The Education Act 1980 requires that parents lindusting carerd-ensure that children of compulsory school age are enabled at and regularly attend school, or are registered with the Office of the Seart of Studies NOW for home schooling. What is a justified reason for being absent from school?

Justified reasons for absences may include the students

- having an unavoetable medical or dental appointment (prefector); these should be made after school or during holideral
- being required to sittend a recognised selectors haliday
- being required to attend an exceptional or separa family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- being sick, by healing an infectious disease.



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
