Any items will be most welcomed! These could include coconut ice, jellies, cupcakes, cookies, cake, toffees or anything you enjoy cooking.





Mrs Miller and all her students were very excited about selling the hommus, salsa and Indian flat bread that they made. They have now started making a profit so that more items can be purchased for the program.






Raffle Tickets
